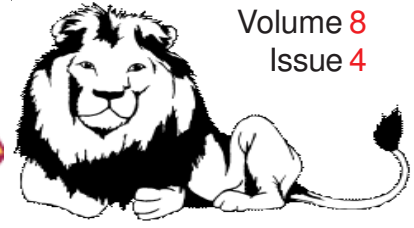

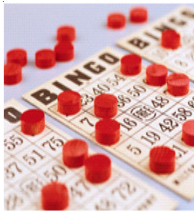
The Troy Community Lions are once again selling 2015 Entertainment Books.

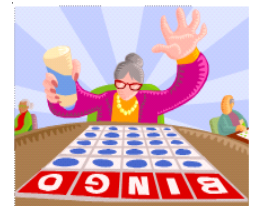

Peace Poster Contest: October To-Do List

1. Keep in touch with the teacher or youth leader who has agreed to work with the students who are preparing the posters for the contest.
2. Collect the completed artwork by mid-October. Double check that the Contest Rules & Conditions such as the theme, the eligible age group (students age 11, 12, or 13 years of age on Nov. 15, 2014), and the strict artwork size guidelines (no smaller than 13 by 20 inches and no larger than 20 by 24 inches) have been met.
3. Arrange to have your Lions club members choose the winning artwork to send to District 11A2.
4. Have the student and the student's parent complete and sign the winner sticker. Apply completed sticker (must be the original, no copies) to the back of the artwork (bottom right),
5. Deliver the winning poster to the District Governor by November 1, 2014.
6. Judging to determine the District winning poster will take place at the 3 region meetings in November.
7. Plan participation awards for all students (ribbons are inexpensive).
8. Plan a special award presentation for your winner. Invite the teacher, student, and parents to a club meeting to receive their awards. Give the school an award plaque to thank them for participating.
9. Publicize the club contest winner.

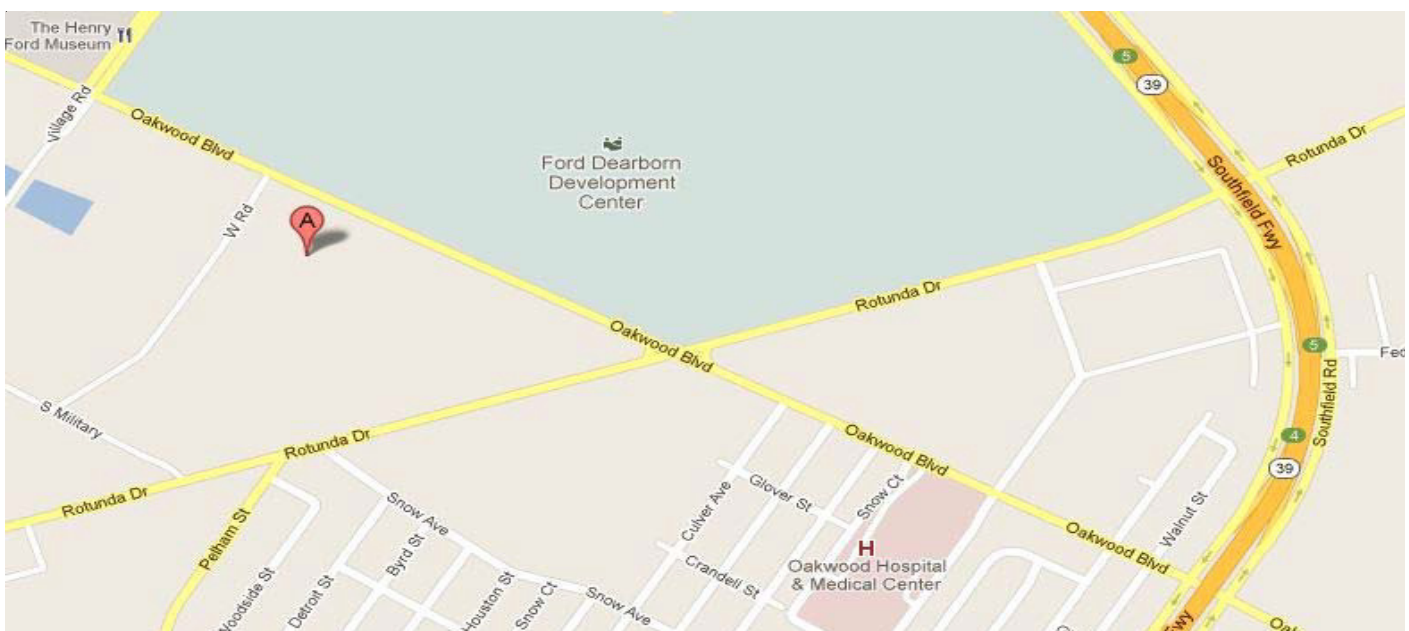
