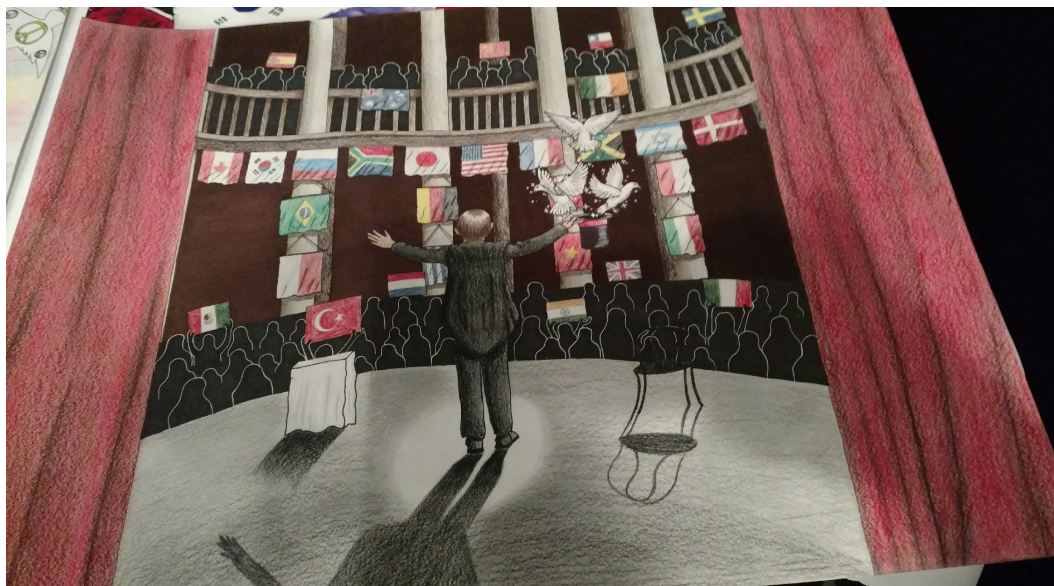

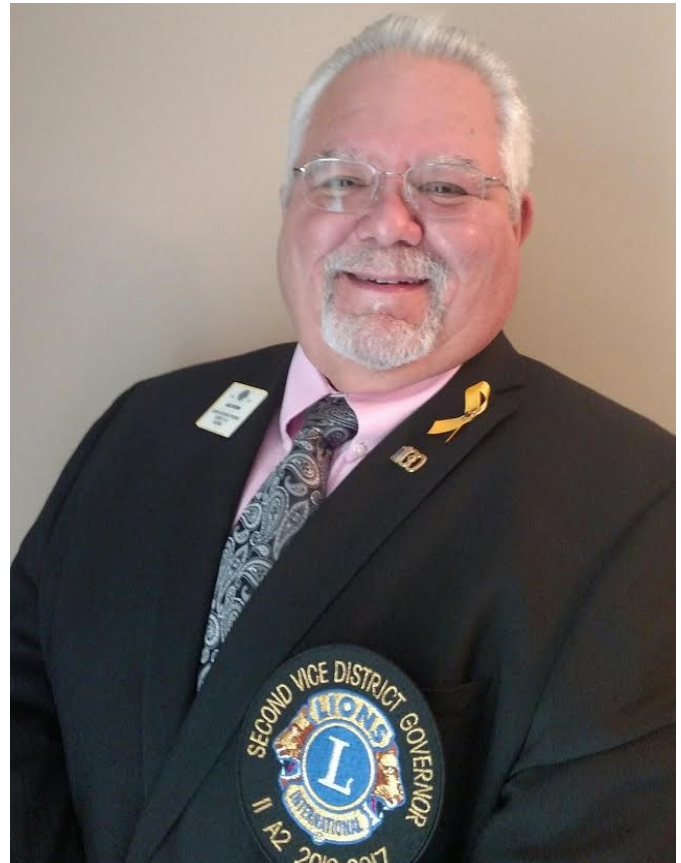
# 2VDG Jack Patton

Bob has a long and active history in Lionism, with nearly 40 years of service.
