Hey, Lions of District 11-A2, we are half-way through our Lionistic year and we are having fun! Personally, I am having fun visiting all of the clubs in Region 2.

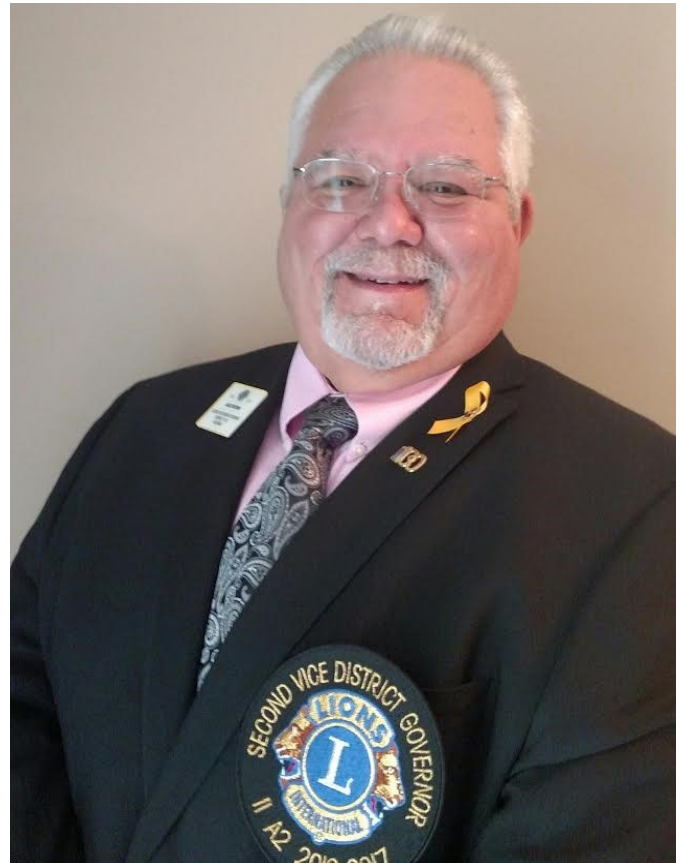

What's Happening Around the District?



The Royal Oak Lions were very busy throughout the Holiday Season! On December 12th they held their annual Christmas party for Beaumont Silent Children. Six children and their parents braved the cold to see Santa (a.k.a. Lion Mark Swan) and to receive gifts. One child is shown here along with Lion JoAnne Swan.

The Royal Oak Lions adopted a family of 8 for Christmas. 13 Lions and a friend purchased the gifts shown here at a cost of over \$2000!



The Royal Oak Lions have helped the Salvation Army ring bells at Christmas for over 50 years. This year 12 Lions brought in nearly \$12,800 and put in over 112 hours ringing bells. This marks the sixth year that they have raised over \$10,000! On Christmas Eve they collected \$4,746.27 in 24.5 hours. The New Baltimore Lions Club has much to be proud of as they look back upon 2016.

In addition to raising \$18,000 to add a large new ramp to the Skate park in town, the Lions Club banded together and raised \$107, 000 to add a landmark to their Anchor Bay waterfront; a 160 foot flagpole! The fund-raising began in March and the flag pole was dedicated on October 15th during a ceremony that attracted over 500 people, including Congresswoman Candice Miller.



Nearly 80 tons of concrete were used to construct a base that is nearly 7 feet in diameter and 30 feet deep! Such a monumental base is required because, at 160 feet, this flag pole is the tallest in the State of Michigan!



The flag is 30x60 feet and is lit by three lights that shine at 23, 000 luminaries each! This new landmark will show the civic and national pride of the new Baltimore community and their extraordinary Lions Club!

MD 11 GLOBAL MEMBERSHIP TEAM STATE CHAIRPERSON OPENING

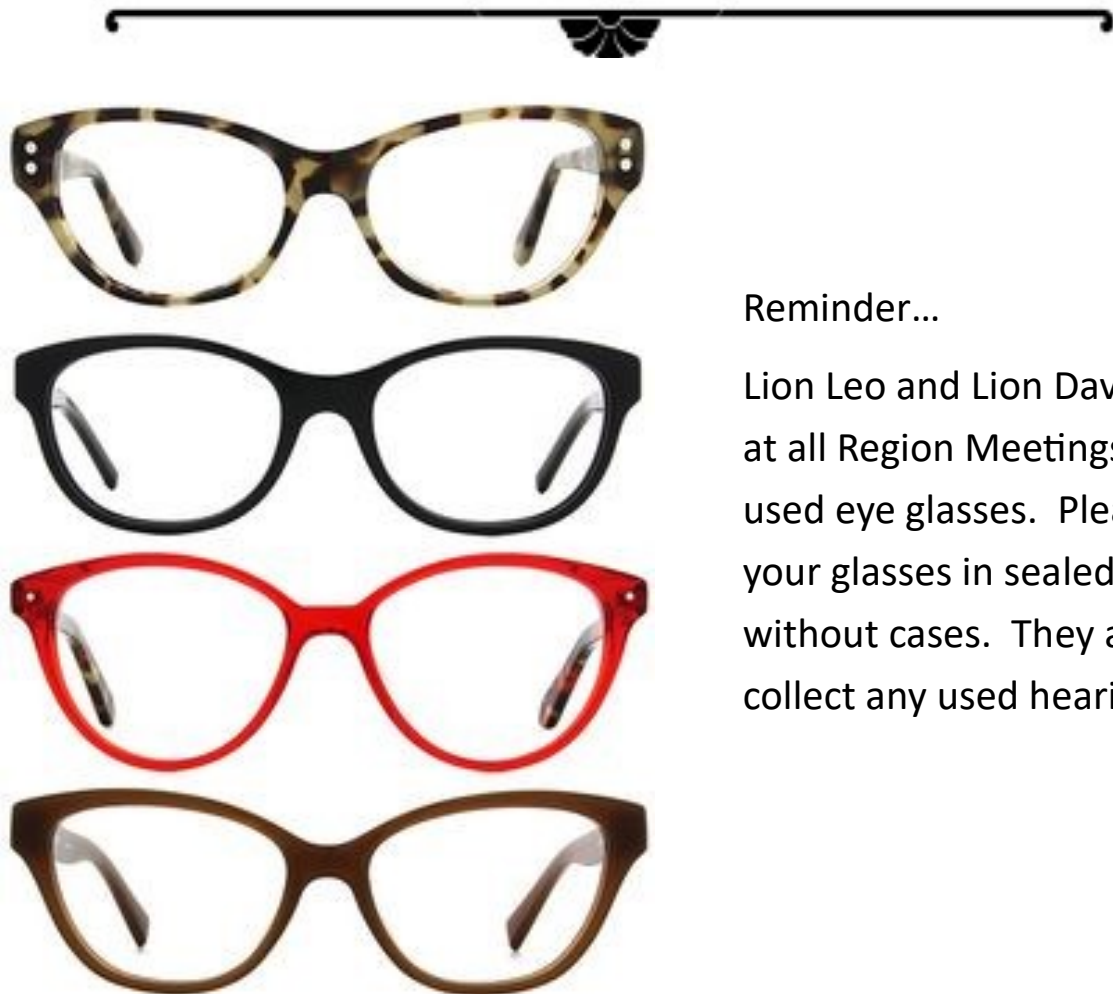

Leader Dogs for the Blind celebrates and honors Lions

This fall season Leader Dogs for the Blind celebrated the collaboration between Lions, Lioness, Leos and Leader Dog with two special nights: Big D Night for Districts 11 D-1 and 11 D-2 and Kick Off for Districts 11 A-1, 11 A-2, and A-1.

The celebrations included honoring the Top Dog Clubs, clubs donating over \$5,000, as well as the prestigious President's Award. The keynote speaker for both event were Lions Janet and David Klinck, parents of guide dog client Andrew Stone. The Klinck's explained the "ripple effect of a guide dog"—how their son's success with a Leader Dog affected them. As Lion David summarized, "I told [Leader Dog client] Andy you now give me no reason to fail at anything."

Each year, the President's Award is given to a Lion who has exemplified the spirit and passion of Lionism for Leader Dog through their advocacy, volunteerism and philanthropy. This year's President Award recipients embodied all three attributes. Nominated by previous awardees, this year's beneficiaries were PDG Jake Dasho of 11 D-1 and PDG Rich Pfeiffer of 11 A-2. Both Lions have been monumental in their support of Leader Dog for many years and we are pleased to honor them and their work.

Recognition to the Top Dog Clubs from these districts was also on the agendas. Almost 5,000 Lion, Lioness and Leo clubs from around the world help to support Leader Dog each year. Only 36 donated at the \$5,000+ level last fiscal year. Seventeen of those clubs are within a two hour radius of campus. Thanks to all the Top Dog Clubs who went over and beyond to help continue our mission of empowering people who are blind, visually impaired or Deaf-Blind with skills for a lifetime of independent travel, opening doors that may seem to have closed with the loss of sight.

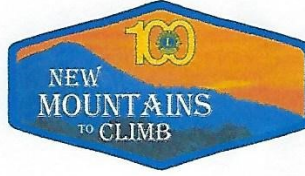

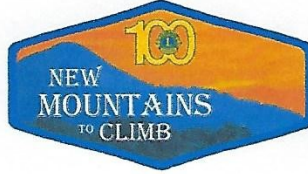
