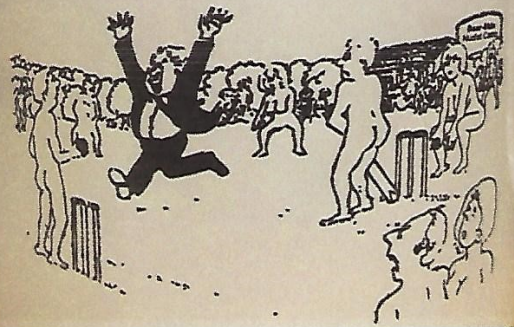

TRAVELING IN AN URBAN ENVIRONMENT



In 2013, Leader Dog conducted our first urban travel guide dog class in Chicago. Designed for people who live, work or travel in large city environments, this specially focused training helps clients and their Leader Dogs learn how to safely navigate crowded streets, subways, elevated trains and other elements unique to large cities.

Catalina Martinez lives in downtown Minneapolis which is quite busy, so training in Chicago was very helpful for her and her Leader Dog Elroy. Especially learning how to safely navigate street construction. "Minneapolis is just finishing remodeling the downtown for the Super Bowl in February. Elroy's an expert at moving through the construction—orange cones, broken cement, temporary sidewalks and having to go into the street.

Like all Leader Dog's programs, Urban Environment training is provided free of charge to clients thanks in part to the continued support of Lions.
