He then turned to all of the District Governor Elect and swore them into office. District 11-A2 Governor John Kantos was one of the 750+ District Governors Elect. After Governor John was swore into his office as District Governor for District 11-A2, Out Going Governor Jim Pettinato pulled off the "Elect" Ribon off the Governors Badge of In Coming District Governor John. Also Out Going District 11-A2 First Lady, Lauraine Pettinato pulled off the "Elect" Ribon off of the District First Lady Badge of Marylin Kontos.


