

Novi Lions Club and Lake Orion Lions Clubs to be honored by Madonna University

On December 6th 2013, at the annual Deo Gratias donor luncheon on the campus of Madonna University, Novi Lions Club and Lake Orion Lions Club will be inducted into the Mother Mary DeSales Lifetime Giving Society and recognized for their tireless and selfless generosity to the Deaf community at Madonna University. For the last 30 years, both Novi and Lake Orion Lions Club have supported several projects for the Deaf on campus as well as supported the Lions and Lioness Scholarship for the Deaf which has helped over 1,000 Deaf students. Projects they have supported include the building of the new Sister Mary Franciline SLS Laboratory and the installation of listening technologies in lecture halls and classrooms. In recent years Sterling Heights Lions Club was the first Lions Club to be inducted into the DeSales Society in 2008 succeeded by Royal Oak Lions Club which was inducted in 2009.

The DeSales Society, as it is known, is reserved for the university's most treasured and generous donors. It is named after Mother Mary DeSales Tocki, who as Provincial Superior (1926-1938) was the founding chairperson of Madonna University. "Deo Gratias" is Latin for *Thanks Be to God* which can be found in the Holy Bible in 1 Corinthians 15:57 but it is also a phrase of special significance to the Felician Sisters who founded Madonna University in 1937. The patron saint of the Felician Sisters is St. Felix of Cantalice (1515-89) who used this interjection so often that people often called him Brother DeoGratias.


