It does not matter if you are at the club level, participating at the district level, involved at the state level or are an officer or board member of any of our district or state projects. Remember you are a steward on how the funds are allocated.

One of our guiding principles is that money received from the community goes back to the community and any administrative costs are handled through our dues and internal fund raising. With this we can state that 100% of the donations received goes to help those in need.

If one suspects that this is the case it is our duty to ask questions and make things right. When a Lions, Lioness or Leo's club sends money to a Lions charity they expect that the funds will be used according to Lions principals and not used for the betterment of a board member, club member or anyone else involved in the organization.

If a board member receives meals, hotel room reimbursement, and other benefits for being a board member they have violated our Lions guidelines. They should refuse the benefit because we participate to make the project better and gather information that we can pass along to our members so they get a good understanding of how their donation help those in need.

I encourage al Lions to look around at how their club operates, how their charities operate and make sure we do what we have always said we do and that is to help those in need with 100% of funds received being used for that purpose.

As Governors we are reimbursed for hotels and meals up to the limit allowed by Lions Clubs International with LCI reimbursing us for three Council of Governors meeting and the state office reimbursing us for the MD convention using the same criteria as LCI. One of our meetings is on our own and these are paid out of the dues all Lions pay to the stare and International. This does not cover all our costs but we understood that when we ran for the position.

Look forward to seeing everyone at the February Region meetings and our theme will be school colors so wear them and brag as much as you can.

Again thank you for allowing me the honor of serving you while you serve those in need.
