A flyer on this has been sent out and is in the newsletter. I will present these donations to 11-D1 Governor Leo at the Council of Governor's meeting at the end of February.

The other item, isn't as easy to do as I had originally thought so I don't have a lot of details on it right now because there is a particular way we have to do this one. This is what I know: Past Region Chairman Philip Maniaci's son, Joey is in the hospital with a life threatening heart virus. They have operated on him and have him in intensive care. Once he has recovered, he will be able to go home and be put on the waiting list for a new heart. He will have to wear a vest that helps his heart pump. This vest needs to be charged up every night so it can work. The house needs to have a whole-house generator installed in case they lose power. I would like to collect funds to help offset this cost. Past Zone Chairman Jim Lykins has volunteered to install the generator if we can purchase it. There is one very big hurdle that we have to clear before we can do something like this. Since it is going to a Lion or a Lion's family, this money cannot be given from a Club's Charity account. So, at the time of this being written, this project has been put on hold. When I have been told that we have everything straight, a flyer will go out with the details that must be followed for this to happen. For right now, please keep Lion Philip, his son Joey and the entire Maniaci Family in your prayers, they can definitely use them.

Coins for Camp update: Project is going great! Many of you have generously donated to First Lady Kim's special project, and the big jar has been filled once and we are on our way to fill it again! We are closing in on \$1,000 in there! Thank you all very much for your generosity! The jar will be at all of the District meetings and ready for your change.

How about the challenge of developing new travel skills and stretching their independence? If so, the Leader Dogs for the Blind Summer Experience Camp was designed with them in mind.
