

Dear Lion Leaders,

Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) is the charitable fundraising and funding arm of our global organization. It enables and empowers the great work Lions clubs do in their communities and provides hope and meaningful impact through humanitarian service projects and grants. LCIF belongs to every Lion and in 2018 LCIF celebrates 50 years of supporting Lions in their service and impacting lives around the world.

Our record of success has positioned us to tackle even more challenges worldwide in our next century of service as Lions. The foundation has chosen to move forward with a US\$300 million capital campaign to support our existing core competencies as well as our new Global Causes.

I have been appointed the Area Coordinator for Michigan, Illinois, Indiana and Kentucky. ID Jenny is the Vice Chairperson of Constitutional Area 1. Both of us were recently at LCI Headquarters in Oak Brook for our training. PID Linda Tincher from Indiana is the Vice Coordinator for this area.

We have been tasked with nominating an MD Coordinator who has demonstrated interest, understanding, commitment and leadership at the MD, District and Club level for LCIF. Our International Officers and the LCIF Board of Trustees will make the official appointments. We are looking for these skills and qualifications: Background of top leadership positions and responsibilities; Deep commitment to Lionism, LCIF and the campaign; Skillful and diplomatic: Decisive and pragmatic; and Utilizes fundraising strategies.

MD 11's share of the \$300 million is \$2,634,500 over the 3 years of the campaign. This figure is based upon the membership in our MD as of November 2017. These funds may be raised through pledges, corporate donations, fundraising activities and personal donations.

The MD Coordinator will work with the DGs and the DGEs to select the sub district coordinator. Each club is to have an LCIF coordinator and if no one volunteers, the default person is the immediate past president.

I have attached a two page PDF that outlines the specific qualifications the LCIF Board and Officers are seeking. You will note that this new LCIF coordinator position is a major undertaking which will require time and the ability to travel within the MD.

If you know someone who may have an interest in being considered for this position, please ask them to send me an email with a brief statement of their fundraising experience and why they would like to be considered for this appointment. Because our time frame is very short as I have to submit a nominee by early April, please have something to me **NO LATER THAN APRIL 9.** ID Jenny and I will review the candidates and recommend the Lion we think will do the best job. Again, it is the officers and the LCIF Trustees who select the coordinator....we only nominate.

As leaders in your respective districts, please let your constituents know about this new direction for the LCIF coordinator and encourage anyone you think will do the best job.

Multiple District Coordinator

Position Overview

As the LCIF Multiple District Coordinator, you will serve as an ambassador for LCIF for your Multiple District (MD) during Lions' most historic and ambitious fundraising campaign ever. Your direct efforts will impact and ensure the success of this campaign. You will ensure that your team of District Coordinators implement LCIF fundraising strategies; educate Lions about the importance and impact of LCIF locally, regionally, and around the world; track progress towards benchmarks and goals; and encourage Lions to support LCIF in all aspects of fundraising across the MD. You will be the guiding force directing the success of the campaign in your MD, inspiring support through your own leadership and commitment.

Actions for Success

- Accepts responsibility for the success of LCIF fundraising and campaign in his/her MD
- Serves as the chief spokesperson for the fundraising campaign in his/her MD
- Leads a team of District Coordinators in implementing fundraising strategies and promoting the campaign
- Collaborates with the Area Coordinator, local Lion leaders, and the LCIF campaign team to coordinate efforts in his/her area, and consults the LCIF Trustees as necessary
- Assesses fundraising opportunities and potential in his/her MD
- Works closely with District Coordinators and Council Chairpersons to establish goals and measures of accountability

- The MD Coordinator will also provide updates to the Council Chairperson and be present at Council meetings as necessary
- Position will require 40%-50% of the Coordinator's time committed to Lions
- Position is voluntary


