In 2019, the National Institute of Health published a study citing cancer as the number 1 cause of job related deaths amongst firefighters. Did you know that? Most people don't. This is why, in the same year that the study was released, a lone firefighter walked 140 miles across the State of Michigan in full gear to raise awareness to this issue.

The statistic hit home for a Macomb Township firefighter named Joe Warne who was aware of multiple brothers and sisters having passed due to cancer. He felt he needed to do something big to draw attention to the issue.



The first walk was grueling. Joe was admittedly unprepared for the challenges he'd face along the way. He set off that first morning with just the well wishes of his firehouse and family. Within the first hour, he had already been rained on, and soon found himself walking in soaking wet shoes. That night, after completing the first leg of his trek, he realized that the sole of his feet had worn off and were raw. Joe did not let this deter him. The next day he set off to complete his journey on bandaged feet knowing that what his fellow firefighter brothers and sisters had endured in their cancer battles was far worse. 3 days later, Joe arrived at the Cascade Township Fire Department in Ada, MI. He immediately resolved to repeat the journey next year, and with that, the annual Walk For The Red was born.

From its humble beginnings to now, the Walk For The Red has grown in size and scope. Realizing how big this one event could be, and the platform it could provide, Joe founded the nonprofit Neighbors United. Today, Neighbors United fundraises year round to provide financial assistance to local firefighters battling cancer, and the families of those who have fallen.

So why am I bringing all of this to your attention? Because I think that when there is a cause or issue that you feel passionate about, or connected to, it is important to become a champion of it. Not only do I admire Joe's passion and resolve, but having friends and family in the firefighting community, I felt compelled to help in whatever way I could.



New Doors Have Opened

A GUIDE DOG STORY - KASSON W., NEW YORK

"I'm 37, I just lost my sight in 2020 just before the pandemic because I was attacked on the subway. I went from seeing to not, just in a day. I'm a people person, I'm a Leo, I used to bartend and I'm the life of the party. I have a close-knit family and I'm a protector. It's been a roller coaster since I lost my eyesight. During the beginning when it was also the start of the pandemic, I thought I would be able to see again, but the eye doctor told me I wouldn't be able to see again. At first, I didn't know there was life after being blind. I have a close-knit family and they tried to do everything for me, and I couldn't handle that. I needed to get past them doing everything which led me to feeling helpless. Then a new season began. It was rough in the beginning; I'm still getting through it... I'm still processing it, but sometimes I think maybe it was blessing because I'm doing things and experiencing things I normally wouldn't do. I feel like new doors have opened for me, everything feels right. I'm going with it and I'm not fighting against it. Leader Dogs for the Blind found me the best dog. I came to get Odyssey because I wanted to be heard. I motivate and inspire a lot of people and now I'm thinking about speaking and helping others."


