If you have an idea on something to do, or not do, let us know. We can make ourselves bigger and better than ever, but the next move is up to us.

Our mission is not just about what Lions International wants us to do, or what the District Governor thinks we can do. We can "Make Our Mark" through our commitment to service and community and achieve the impossible. Bringing in new members and chartering new clubs gains us a wealth of new knowledge, ideas, and experience. It broadens our horizons and opens up new possibilities. It also gives us a greater leadership base to work with. I have said it before and I will say it again, Lions International has some of the best leadership training available. 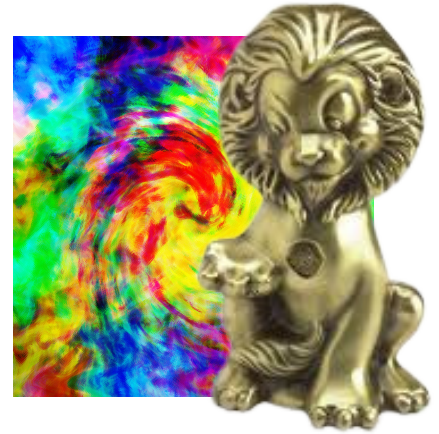

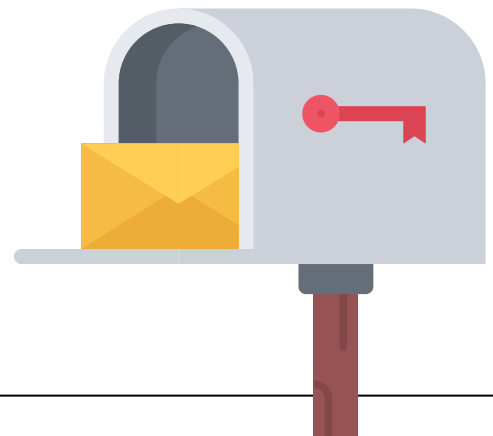
