Governor Shares Goals For Upcoming Year

We have lost too many Lions in the past couple of months. They all shared themselves and made our lives and the lives of others richer through their service. I had the honor and privilege of saying goodbye to PDG Joe Wilson on behalf of myself and Lions everywhere and thanking him for his service. PDG Joe and I had a family and work history as well as Lions and he always brightened my day when I got to see him. His laugh and love of life was infectious, and he will be missed. All our lost Lions will be greatly missed!



In the interest of sharing, I was asked to share my goals for the year with all of you and make sure we are all headed in the same direction. So here we go:

Membership: Our team will start one new club, acquire 134 new members and have a net gain of -7 at the end of the year. This goal was given by Lions International, and I accepted it. It does not mean we can't surpass it. We have GMT Shawn Blaszczyk and GET Leo Schaefer both working on new clubs, one in each county, and I know you are all doing your best to bring in new members. Unfortunately, as mentioned above, we cannot stop Lions from passing away, so we need to keep the ones we have. If you're not seeing a member, find out if they're okay and if we lose one, we need to find out why. Don't forget that transferring to another club is always an option if someone is no longer comfortable in a particular club's atmosphere. We would rather see someone move than lose them.

Service: Our team will ensure that 90% of the clubs in our district report service. This one should be easy as only one service project needs to be reported and we should be able to reach 100%. I know that you are all out there performing service. If your secretary is having trouble reporting, please contact DA/GST Cheryl Satterthwaite. That's what the District Administrator is all about.

- Leadership Development: Our team will ensure that 100% of Zone Chairs attend training and 30% of our clubs attend club officer training. I believe that GLT Jim Leach, Jr. is doing a great job. We got 100% of our Zone Chairs trained and we are probably close to the 30% for club officer training. So, if you are a club officer and weren't able to attend the training sessions, call Lion Jim and he can help set you up for the Lions Learning Center and we can get credit that way.
- LCIF: Our team will ensure a 2% individual participation increase and a 2% club increase in donations. Please, please, please, consider making your own personal donation to LCIF. It is rewarding and doesn't have to be a bunch of money all at one time. Our LCIF Chair, PRC Maureen Kennedy, has been telling us for a couple of years that you can donate \$5 per month. If you need help or more information, ask her. I'm not overly concerned with club contributions as we generally excel in that category, but feel free to add a few more dollars to your donation. We have all seen the results of our donations coming back to us in grants.
- ✓) Personal Goal: Our team will ensure that we place one brand new children's book in each library in our district. This is my goal. In case you missed it through the last few years, reading is very important to me. I remember as a kid, my dad would take us to the library and as soon as we could print our name, we got our own library card. I was very proud of that library card and for a good portion of my life, we as a family or later by myself would go to the library every three weeks (that's how long you could check out a book for) and get new books to read. Everyone should know how to read and that generally starts as kids. I will be contacting all 60 of the libraries in our district sometime early next year to find out what they need or want us to purchase for them. In the meantime, our District Tail Twister, Jim Bone, will be helping us collect funds as he fines you at various meetings. CST Kimberly Thiede is also helping by putting together baskets (the first one is actually a wagon) full of goodies and selling chances to win for \$5. There will be 4 baskets, and we will give one away during each round of district meetings. The first one is available now and tickets will be sold at each upcoming Region meeting. Please also feel free to make a personal donation.

2023-2024 LCIF Donations Report

Dear Wonderful Lions of District 11A2:

It has taken a while for finalization of LCIF donations for 2023-2024 but donations for June (the end of the Lion Year) were finalized this month of August. (I guess that's what happens when there is a new platform to work with plus over 49,000 Clubs in the world.) Once again, District 11A2, YOU HAVE DONE YOURSELVES PROUD!!!!!

Congratulations on surpassing our goal for 2023-2024 and surpassing the "stretch" goal which Past International President Brian Sheehan, who headed up LCIF for 2023-2024, gave us.

Our District contributed \$46,195.00 to LCIF for 2023-2024. 31 of 32 Clubs (which also includes donations from individuals in that Club) donated; that's 97% of our Clubs. Let's aim for 100% for 2024-2025.

I suppose there could be some friendly competitions going on this year. For the Lion Year, 2022-2023, The New Baltimore Lions Club led our District in donations to LCIF; for 2023-2024, The Shelby Township Lions led our District. Going forward, please, remember that your individual donations to LCIF count towards your own Melvin Jones/Progressive Melvin Jones and that donation also counts towards your Club donation.

Also, you may remember that LCIF will be glad to accept your donation of \$5.00 a month if you choose to do so. If you have not made an individual donation to LCIF, I know that \$5.00 a month works so you may want to try it.

The Golden Kettle Competition Among Service Clubs By Captain Mika Roinila

The Salvation Army proposes the awarding of a Golden Kettle to the service club that raises the most money during the annual Christmas Kettle Campaign. The winners will receive a traveling Golden Kettle trophy that will remain with the winners until the next year's competition begins. The scale of the competition can be determined by decision-makers. However, it was originally created in an appointment area only.

The Golden Kettle was started (for the Roinila's) with the 2017 Christmas Campaign in Hannibal, MO. For history and background on the golden kettle, see this article:

Service clubs got engaged, and updates were published weekly in the local paper to keep everyone informed of the changes in the standings. Captains Roinila were appointed to Fulton Heights Citadel in Grand Rapids, MI, in 2019, and they conducted the Golden Kettle competition amongst service clubs for three years. It was first promoted on Nov. 21, 2019 in the Grand Rapids Rapidian: https://therapidian.org/salvation-army-award-golden-kettle

The winner for the 2019 campaign was the Golden K Kiwanis Club; the 2020 award went to the Kentwood Rotary Club, which received recognition by the club on their website: https://ridistrict6290.org/stories/kentwood-rotary-awarded-the-2020-golden-kettle

In 2021, the Golden Kettle award went again to the Golden K Kiwanis Club, having raised \$10,844 (see https://www.therapidian.org/salvation-army-award-golden-kettle-golden-k-kiwanis-club).

Captains Roinila were appointed to Battle Creek, MI, in 2021. Again, they got service clubs to ring bells and compete for the Golden Kettle. The 2022 winners came from the Masons of Ira A. Beck Lodge. The winner for 2023 was American Legion Post 257. See these following stories:

Statistics of the ongoing competition are shared weekly in local papers such as the Rapidian in Grand Rapids and the Shopper News in Battle Creek. Photos of bell ringers from every club are shared with each club, many of which are posted on Facebook as well.

Plans for the competition begin in the summer, and visits to all local service clubs are needed to introduce the competition to everyone. The name and address of club chairmen and leaders are gathered quickly so that presentations can be secured in their schedules. Shifts and locations are the responsibility of any club that wants to get involved. Clubs must sign in with Register-to-Ring when the season opens in October 2024.

At the conclusion of the Christmas campaign, all results are tabulated **but not announced**. An awards ceremony is scheduled for the end of January when all service clubs are invited, as well as all volunteers who rang bells to an event where their efforts are recognized.

- Certificates are awarded to all individuals and/or groups that participated in the campaign.
- The Golden Kettle Award is given last.

Once the winner is announced, the trophy can be passed from last year's winners to the new winner, as the trophy is handed off by one group to the next.

 If the same group repeats as the winner, the corps officer can award the trophy to the winners. Then the trophy can "travel" from one club in the winning organization to the next.

The ultimate idea of the competition is to get all Rotarians, Optimists, Elks, Kiwanians, Lions, Legion posts, Masonic lodges, etc. to join forces in order to win the trophy and bragging rights.

Individual chapters and clubs competing against one another don't achieve as much as a collective effort by all. It's one for all, and all for one!

Competition can expand across counties and across the state, and this is one way in which the Christmas Kettle Campaign can be a great success.

We can attest that there is much interest in the competition, and the return on investment (ROI) shows continued growth.

Clawson Lions Mark 26th Annual Car Show
